A **secured drop box** has been installed on the door of the Parish Office for envelope drop off.

The history of the St. Vincent de Paul Society of Corpus Christi Parish began in the summer of 2006. A group of parishioners committed to serving the poor and disadvantaged in the Conneaut area met to evaluate the "Rule" of the St. Vincent de Paul Society and how it could be put into service in our parish and local community. The parish donated the first 100 dollars to begin the treasury and we were in business. Through monthly collections, grants and memorial donations, this group of members worked to provide emergency assistance to more than three thousand individuals in our area. Once our generous parishioners and friends began providing the funds for the assistance in an abundance that humbled us monthly, we were able to apply to the International Council General in Paris, France, to recognize our Conneaut conference as a legitimate member of the International St. Vincent de Paul Society. On March 16, 2009, a member of the Diocesan St. Vincent de Paul Society presented our parish Society with our Certificate of Aggregation. It was a great accomplishment for all of our devoted members and parishioners.

Through the fourteen years of serving the parish and community, our Society has provided emergency assistance for rent, utilities, food, medicine and many more occasions in which people were in need. We have sponsored the "Small Soles" program which provides new shoes for children and H.A.L.O. (a Christmas program) in conjunction with Catholic Charities. We have provided basic necessity baskets for local seniors and school supplies for local children. We consistently evaluate our assistance and brainstorm ideas for new areas in which to aid the community. We have enjoyed the loyal support of Father Thomas, Father Miller and Nick Perkoski in continuing our mission. We began with the 100 dollar gift from the parish and have now collected more than \$150,000 in fourteen years to provide for the basic needs of our neighbors.

Blessed Frederick Ozanam, the founder of the Society, believed in the inestimable worth of each human being. His teachings and service are reflected in our local Society. Please consider becoming a member. Due to Covid-19, we are not meeting in person. We will resume meetings as soon as it is safe. The date and time will be announced in the parish bulletin. At this time, we are relying on the donations of our parishioners and friends that are mailed to the parish office – 744 Mill Street. The need for assistance is always present in our community and even in these unusual times, we continue to serve those in need.
