Amid the COVID-19 Pandemic, the **Bishop's Appeal** process has continued. With all that is going on, we have not updated that information lately.

As of April 23, Corpus Christi Parish has a participation rate of 20% which is 125 out of 638 families. Our Parish has pledged \$17,761 compared to just over \$26,000 in 2019.

Of all registered households in our Diocese, 21.48% have responded thus far with a total commitment of \$2,870,294 which is one million short of the 2019 Appeal. Those who have not yet responded will receive a follow-up letter offering the opportunity to Pledge your Prayers and/or Monetary Gift.

Obviously, everyone is doing what they can during these trying times. We Thank God for the generosity of so many.



Blessing Box

During these past several weeks our **Blessing Box** in front of the Parish Center has had a lot of activity. There have been a few faithful contributors who have been stocking the box and noticed that the box is emptied very shortly after having been filled. If you happen to go by and notice the box is low or empty of donations, you are encouraged to donate as you are able.
