#### **Fasting and Abstinence During Lent**

Obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat.

It is an obligation to fast from age 18 to 59. Fasting means a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Catholic Charities launched the *Warm Hearts for Warm Homes* campaign (formerly Keep the Kids Warm) in 2008 in response to the economic recession impacting many local families.
